Navy League Honor Cites London's Contributions to Maritime Strength and National Security

(Jack) London, Chairman, President, and Chief Executive Officer (CEO), has received the Navy League of the United States Fleet Admiral Chester A. Nimitz Award. The Navy League is a non-profit organization dedicated to supporting sea service members and their families and educating all Americans about the importance of seapower to U.S. national security. The League will present the award before an audience of senior military leaders and industry peers at their annual Sea-Air-Space dinner on April 4, 2007 at the Marriott Wardman Park Hotel in Washington, D.C.

The Nimitz award is named after Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz, whose qualities of leadership, statesmanship, and dedication exemplify his commitment to the need for a strong maritime defense supported by American industry. At the height of his career, as Commander-in-Chief of the Pacific Fleet during World War II, he commanded more than two million men and women, 5,000 ships and 20,000 planes.

Dr. London has served as CACI's CEO for 23 of his 35 years with the company. He joined as a program manager in 1972, advanced through corporate leadership, and as CEO in 1984 began engineering CACI's growth and transformation from a small business and professional services firm to a major information technology provider. He was elected Chairman in 1990 and successfully focused the company on emerging opportunities in such areas as information security and intelligence, while also setting company records for revenue and profit growth.
