## Sentencing in Jemal case delayed a day

D.C. developer Douglas Jemal will have to wait another day to find out if he's going to jail.

Jemal, who last October was convicted of wire fraud but cleared of bribery and conspiracy charges, was to be sentenced Monday morning before Judge Ricardo Urbina in U.S. District Court. The hearing, however, has been rescheduled for Tuesday at 10 a.m., according to the court.

The sentencing has been delayed because Urbina was sick, according to one of Jemal's attorneys, Reid Weingarten, a partner at law firm Steptoe & Johnson.

A senior official at Jemal's Douglas Development, Blake Esherick, was also found guilty of wire fraud. Esherick was found guilty of two counts of tax evasion as well. In March, he was sentenced to eight months in prison.
